A couple weeks ago, a mother and her five-year-old daughter came to our morning service, ate lunch with us, and stayed for the afternoon service as well. The mother was one of our former adult students when we used to tutor English in our home several years ago. She is a Christian and wanted to see us again after some time past. Last week, we had a woman in her 50s or 60s attend our morning service. That was a blessing and encouragement.

Eleanor is busy studying for her middle school test which she will try to take in August of this year. Alivia is studying various subjects, with a focus on computer science/engineering. We continue to ask prayer for the future of our children, that God would guide their lives into His will and show them what He would have them to do.
